Board of Directors

Ted Chesnutt, Oak Ridge Rowing Association

1. At this time, the board has tremendous opportunities to grow the membership, development outstanding national teams, and become more financially sound. Through the many activities that I have participated in within this port, I have a profound understanding of the heartbeat of all rowers in general and the Southeast specifically. Rowing is my life and I am willing to work to make this happen one step or one stroke at a time with each rower.
2. I have been active within this sport for 25 years; as athlete, coach, administrator, referee and now vendor. I currently sit on the Masters Committee while at the same time have had the honor to help grow one of the oldest living boat builders successfully re-establish his brand of rowing shell in the global market place. As a referee, I have worked with LOC's throughout the borders of the U.S. in every position. I still row.

Thomas Feaster, The Stewards Foundation

1. Over the past decade, I have become increasingly aware of the parochialism that exists in our sport today. This is true at all levels and includes youth, high school, college, masters, men and women. This passion for their unique classification is sometimes at odds with the overall mission of promoting and participating in the sport of rowing. It is my goal as a member of the Board of Directors to create better awareness of our sport.
2. I was a founder of the crew program at Father Judge High School, Philadelphia and was the winner of the championship single at the 1965 Schoolboy Rowing Championships. At Marietta College, I rowed in the 1967 Big Eight that won the Dad Vail and competed in England and Germany. I served as head coach at Marietta H.S., the University of Rhode Island, The Sanford Naval Academy and the University of Tampa.
